

General Information Erasmus+ International Credit Mobility (E+ KA 107) Mobility with partner countries - call 2020

What is Erasmus + KA 107?

Erasmus+ is the European Union's program for education, youth and sport. The program comprises three key actions (KA), the first covers the promotion of learning mobility of individuals. Part of this key action is Erasmus+ KA 107 which promotes mobility projects with non-European countries worldwide – so-called partner countries.¹ Erasmus+ KA 107 supports individual mobility for the purpose of study, research, training and teaching with higher education institutions (HEI) in partner countries.

The Erasmus+ programme aims at promoting equity and inclusion by facilitating the access to participants with disadvantaged backgrounds and fewer opportunities. Within the E+ KA 107 special fundings will be made available for for students and university staff members with an attested degree of disability above 50.² Students with a degree of disability of 30 or higher as well as students travelling with children may receive a so-called social top-up of 200,00 EUR per month.³

Who can be funded under Erasmus+ KA 107

- PhD Students - mobility of min. 3 to max. 12 months.
- University staff members - mobility for the purpose of teaching or training (participation in conferences is not eligible) of min. 5 days of mobility + 2 days of travel to max. 60 days.
- Incoming mobility (from a partner country to Germany) and outgoing mobility (from Germany to a partner country) can be funded.

Amount of funding

The funding consists of a contribution to the daily allowance costs and a contribution to the travel costs.

Contribution to costs of stay (daily allowance)

- Incoming PhD candidates from partner country to Germany: 850 EUR per month
- Outgoing PhD candidates from Germany to partner country: 700 EUR per month
- Incoming staff from partner country to Germany: 160 EUR per day⁴
- Outgoing staff from Germany to partner country: 180 EUR per day⁴

Special funding

- Students with a degree of disability of 30 or higher as well as students travelling with children: Social top-up of 200,00 EUR per month
- Students and university staff members with an attested degree of disability above 50: Special funds of max. 10.000 EUR (individual application required)

¹ The European Commission differs between program and partner countries. Whereas the term partner countries refers to all countries outside Europe, program countries are all member states of the European Union as well as Norway, Island, Liechtenstein, Serbia, North Macedonia and Turkey. ² In order to receive special funds, a separate application at the NA DAAD is required.

³ The social top-up needs to be covered by the granted budget of the respective country.

⁴ Daily rate until day 14 of mobility, from day 15 on 70 % of the daily allowance.

Contribution to travel costs (one lump sum payment):

The amount of the travel lump sum depends on the distance between place of departure and destination.

Travel distances	Amount
Between 100 and 499 KM:	180 EUR per participant
Between 500 and 1999 KM:	275 EUR per participant
Between 2000 and 2999 KM:	360 EUR per participant
Between 3000 and 3999 KM:	530 EUR per participant
Between 4000 and 7999 KM:	820 EUR per participant
8000 KM or more:	1500 EUR per participant

Time frame and deadlines

- Application Deadline: February 5th 2020
- Project duration: 36 months
- Project start date: August 1st 2020
- Project end date: July 31st 2023

Application Procedure at TU Berlin

Within the Erasmus+ KA 107 program, only ONE application per university can be submitted. An application may comprise several parts – so-called “Teilanträge”. Every partner country included in the application forms one “Teilantrag”. The overall application will be coordinated and submitted to the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) by the International Projects Section of the Department of International Affairs at TU Berlin.

A committee led by TU Berlin’s Vice President for Strategic Development, Junior Scholars and Teacher Education, Ms. Prof. Angela Ittel, has decided on the following partner countries and universities to be considered for the 2020 application:

- Egypt – Ain Shams University
- Ethiopia – Addis Abeba University
- Iran – University of Tehran
- Russian Federation – Peter the Great St. Petersburg Polytechnic University (SPbPU)
- South Africa – University of the Witwatersrand (Wits) and
– University of Cape Town (UCT)
